Pastor's Message

Penetcost May 19, 2024 You are called to testify

Jesus said, "But when the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father—the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father—he will testify about me. And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning," *John* 15:26-27

In the stillness of an upper room, where whispers of anticipation mingled with the soft glow of oil lamps, the disciples gathered. Their hearts, heavy with recent events, sought comfort in each

other's company. As they huddled together, Jesus spoke of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who would descend upon them, breathing life into their weary souls. He said the Advocate would come and testify about him, and they too must testify of all they had witnessed as his disciples.

Congregational Council Meeting, April 8, 2024

† A six o'clock pm regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA was called into session by Council President Zola Finch. Council members present were Kent Nelson, A.J. Ferrell, Stacy Bubach, Jana Thompson, Misty Schroeder, Devin Koestner, Ashleigh Hillen and Frank Pascoe. Also present were Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe and Pastor David Viles, and parishioner Jason Wood, chair of St. Paul's Safety & Security Team.

† The meeting opened with a prayer by Pastor Viles. The President requested approval of the previous Council minutes of March 11th. This was accomplished upon a motion offered by Kent Nelson, seconded by Jana Thompson and agreed by all. The President requested Church Treasurer Kay Pascoe present the details of the Church's current financial position. The Treasurer presented a four-page Statement of Financial Position, dated March 31, 2024. The statement showed total liabilities and net assets of \$314,549.66; dedicated accounts ending balance of \$33,563.13; and current month income a positive \$3,524.08 over monthly expenses. The President requested approval of the Treasurer's report which was approved upon a motion offered by Misty Schroeder, and seconded by Stacy Bubach. The Treasurer noted that two December cheques to the local school district had not been cashed. Council member Misty Schroeder said she had delivered the cheques and would inquire as to why they have not been cashed.

† At this point, President Finch requested Council guest, Jason Wood, to address the Council regarding his and President Finch's recent discussions concerning St. Paul's safety and security measures. Much discussion followed about the best way to approach security for the church and the church council will continue to discuss and investigate methods for trying to keep our congregation safe during services.

† President Finch requested Pastor Viles present his monthly summary of recent activities. His report detailed no request for mileage, noted eight monthly meetings, including Freundschaft, Lions Club, Lohman City Council, S.T.A.R.S., and area Ministerial Alliance. Pastor detailed numerous meetings, including those for upcoming baptisms, weddings, and personal meetings, as well as conversations and prayers with our parishioners and others. Pastor changed the Carillion song selections, attended Spring Clean-Up, prepared bulletins, updated the Church's website, posted daily Facebook photos and messages, and created and e-mailed the April Epistle. Pastor's services for March were numerous, including three Wednesday night Lenten services, one Maundy Thursday service with Communion, one Good Friday service, three Communion Sunday Services in-person and online, and three non-communion Sunday services in-person and online. In all, a very busy March 2024.

President Finch requested the Council member's committee reports and activities:

Evangelism: Misty Schroeder reported on a very successful breakfast following the early Easter Morning Sunrise Service at St. Paul's on March 31st. She thanked our members who prepared the event. She also did the same for those who prepared the April 7th pancake breakfast, which was also well attended. A total of \$2,195.00 was taken in before expenses. Misty said she was contemplating the preparation of a spaghetti supper for the church's youth in the future.

Technology: Devin Koestner reported that the Will West business has yet to inform him of the details of the proposed screens for the sanctuary, on their sizes and locations. There was a brief discussion on the problems with Facebook's live presentation of our service. Other issues under discussion are YouTube utilization for our services, and the issue of using music not authorized for live services.

Parish Education: A.J. Ferrell reported on the very entertaining Easter Egg Hunt on Easter morning which was well attended by our children and well supplied with the colorful eggs. A.J. reported that the month of June will be a vacation time for the children and youth. There will be Sunday School classes on the 1st and 3d Sundays in August. Vacation Bible School will be held in July. A.J. will begin thinking about resuming the annual Christmas program for the children.

Worship & Music: The Council welcomed new Council member Ashleigh Hillen, who will chair this Committee in the future after the departure of Kathy Meller. Ashleigh is becoming familiar with the monthly hymn selection process and other committee activities.

Church Improvement: Chair Kent Nelson reported that 14 parishioners turned out to work on the church yards on Clean-up Day. Special thanks and appreciation were expressed for the members who prepared the great breakfast for the workers. Kent said he would contact a local sign company to repair or replace the neon cross on the front of the church. The refrigerator now seems to be working. The next item of work will focus on the sanctuary ceiling fans, especially the one near the pulpit which malfunctions. Kent reported that three trees on parish grounds need to come down due to recent wind and fungus damage. He is also looking into recent power overloads and outages which interfered with the piano keyboard music on a recent Sunday.

Stewardship & Finance: Chair Stacy Bubach reported no recent meeting.

Mutual Ministry: Chair Jana Thompson reported no recent meeting.

Old Business: President Finch reported that our Independence Day celebration will take place on Sunday Evening of June 30th. The regular participation of Lohman Lions Club and ice-cream man Doug Starr is expected. The WELCA members will do their usual food treats.

New Business: President Finch will re-work and republish the Council and members work/participation calendar to reflect our new Council changes. Devin Koestner reported some concerns expressed about the flowers in the church yard between the parsonage and the sanctuary. Some of the artificial flowers need to be replaced with real and fresh plants. He volunteered to look into solutions to making needed changes to this area.

There being no further business, the President requested a motion to adjourn. Kent Nelson proposed the motion, seconded by Frank Pascoe and passed via voice.

The WELCA Mid-Missouri Spring Gathering was held at Our Savior's Lutheran Church Saturday, April 27, 2024, right here in Jefferson City, making it super easy for Donita Stubinger, Marie Scheperle, Kathryn Linsenbardt, Audrey Bunch and Erika Gerth to participate, along with women from nine sister congregations in the Osage Cluster. We were greeted with a wonderful assortment of baked goods, fresh fruit, and beverages, prepared by the women of the host church. Gloria Sharp, president of the Central States WELCA and also a member of Our Savior's, greeted us warmly. Our own Marie Scheperle led the group in the first of two Sing-A-Longs including Morning Has Broken, Borning Cry and Shine, Jesus, Shine. Pastor Scott Musselman, Our Savior's J.C., led the Bible study based on Matthew 6:25-34, the familiar

text in which Jesus, tells us, among other things, not to worry. In concluding the study, each person was invited to write a specific worry on a piece of paper, place it in the offering plate and surrender it to God's care.

What is a gathering if it doesn't include a business meeting and this one was no different! We were updated on the re-organization of the Central States Synod Women of the ELCA, which is now divided into five Clusters instead of twelve. St. Paul's belongs to the Osage Cluster. The Central States Synod Convention will take place every two years, instead of annually. In the off-years, the five Clusters will hold their own meetings, and on the national level, the Women of the ELCA will continue to convene every three years. Confusing? Yes, indeed, but stay tuned: we will keep you posted on upcoming events!

Having diligently worked hard throughout the morning, participating in the Bible study, keeping track of all the administrative changes, and other matters of importance, we were rewarded with a delicious lunch, featuring a variety of scrumptious salads and numerous desserts, all lovingly prepared by our host church.

One of the joys of attending these Gatherings is the opportunity to learn about agencies which improve the lives of children and adults in the host church's community. We were privileged to hear Hannah Pond, Youth Advocate for HALO Jefferson City, share information about this vital program which addresses the needs of homeless girls. Yes, there are girls right here in Jefferson City who have no place to call home. They couch hop from one place to another, sometimes sleep in their car, if they have one, until they are referred by a counselor or friend to the HALO House for Girls. Here they find not only a safe place to live but receive services to help rebuild their lives. Currently there are 15 girls, ages 16-20, at HALO House. They go to school and have jobs; they engage in therapeutic art activities, enjoy activities with a host of volunteers and together with HALO House staff, build a sense of community.

Understanding that God's work requires financial support, an offering was received from the individual attendees and from their units. St. Paul's WELCA contributed \$200.00 of the \$977.00 which was received. Half of that amount will be sent to the Central States Women of the ELCA and the remaining half will be divided equally between HALO, Jefferson City Center, and the Central States Synod educational fund.

Finally, St. Paul's women are invited to join the women from the entire Osage Cluster on Saturday, June 1, 2024, at St. Paul's, Cole Camp. It will be a joyous occasion. Plan to attend!
