





Render evil to those who spy on me; in your faithfulness, destroy them.


## I will offer you a freewill sacrifice and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

# \*The 2<sup>nd</sup> lesson is a reading from James, the 3rd and 4th chapters.

Who is wise and understanding among you? Show by your good life that your works are done with gentleness born of wisdom. But if you have bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not be boastful and false to the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, devilish. For where there is envy and selfish ambition, there will also be disorder and wickedness of every kind. But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy. And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace. Those conflicts and disputes among you, where do they come from? Do they not come from your cravings that are at war within you? You want something and do not have it; so you commit murder. And you covet something and cannot obtain it; so you engage in disputes and conflicts. You do not have, because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, in order to spend what you get on your pleasures. Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you.

### \*<u>The Holy Gospel according to Mark, the 9th chapter</u>. C: Glory to you, O Lord.

[Jesus and the disciples went on] and passed through Galilee. He did not want anyone to know it; for he was teaching his disciples, saying to them, "The Son of Man is to be betrayed into human hands, and they will kill him, and three days after being killed, he will rise again." 





**Hymn History –** Our Gathering song "Built on a Rock" is from the Community in Christ section of our hymnal. It was written by Nicolai Grundtvig after his 1811 ordination in Copenhagen. Prior to his ordination, Nicolai struggled in formal education with an overactive mind and a versatile imagination that couldn't bear the restraint of academic learning. At his ordination his sermon subject was "Why has the Lord's word disappeared from His house," which attracted much attention. Nicolai became prolific in studying literature and writing both secular and religious poetry and hymns. He received penalties for speaking out in support of opposition to rational and traditional religious teaching in favor of truer principles of Christian belief, and sounder views of the nature of the Church. These controversial views were considered evangelistic at the time. Our hymn "Built on a Rock" has long been a favorite among Scandinavians and Lutherans and included seven stanzas in the 1941 Lutheran Hymnal published by Concordia.
