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



Christ said, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart."





Lift up your heads, O gates; and be lifted up, O everlasting doors, that the King of glory may come in.



*<u>The Holy Gospel according to John, the 11th chapter</u>. C: Glory to you, O Lord.



Hymn History – Charles Wesley (1707 – 1788) was the great hymn writer of the Wesley family, considered by many to be the greatest of all ages. The 18th child of Samuel and Susanna Wesley, he went to Westminster School at Christ Church, Oxford. As his religious impressions were deepened, he became one of the first band of "Oxford Methodists." One of his missions was to minister to prisoners. He was outspokenly troubled about his closest brother John's relations of Methodism to the Church of England, but there was never a breach in their friendship. John was deeply grieved that Charles would not consent to be interred in the burial ground where John had prepared his own grave, but Charles said, "I have lived, and I die, in the Communion of the Church of England, and I will be buried in the yard of my parish church." As a hymn-writer Charles Wesley was unique. He is said to have written no less than 6500 hymns, inspired by his religious conversion and marriage, invasions, riots, church festivals, doctrines, scenes in Scripture history, death of friends, and other observations he made of God's works. Today we sing the hymn of his divine gift in our sending song "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling."
