

Children's Sermon

WORD

The 1st lesson is a reading from Isaiah, the 53rd chapter.

Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper. Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge. The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong: because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Psalm 91 (Read Responsively)

Because you have made the Lord your refuge, and the Most High your habitation,

They will call me, and I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble; I will rescue and honor them.


With long life will I satisfy them, and show them my salvation.

The 2nd lesson is a reading from Hebrews, the 5th chapter.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.



Hymn History - Our sending song, "O Master, Let Me Walk with Thee" was written by Congregational Pastor Washington Gladden in 1879. During this post-Civil War time of racial and economic injustice, Pastor Gladden became an activist for political and moral reform in industry, commerce, and politics. He even upset his own denomination by railing against John D. Rockefeller Sr. and Standard Oil Company for giving \$100,000 of "tainted money" to the Congregational Church's Foreign Missions Program. During a period of heavy criticism for what was considered his liberal theology, Pastor Gladden composed the hymn. It has become a hymn and prayer sung by many Christian of "all stripes" as we worship the Master. The Hymn is sung to the tune "Maryton", composed by H. Percy Smith in 1874.
