




Let them praise the name of the Lord, whose name only is exalted, whose splendor is over earth and heaven.


# \*<u>The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 2<sup>nd</sup> chapter</u>. C: Glory to you, O Lord.



Hymn History - Our gathering song "Once in Royal David's City" was written by Cecil Frances Humphries. Born in 1818 in Ireland, as a small child Cecil wrote poetry in her school's journal. In 1850 she married Rev. William Alexander, who later became the Anglican primate (chief bishop) of Ireland. She showed her concern for disadvantaged people by traveling many miles each day to visit the sick and the poor, providing food, warm clothes, and medical supplies. She and her sister also founded a school for the deaf. Her first book of poetry "Verses for Seasons" was a "Christian Year" for children. She wrote hymns based on the Apostles' Creed, baptism, the Lord's Supper, the Ten Commandments, and prayer, writing in simple language for children. Our gathering song was written to explain this part of the Apostles' Creed: "Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary." Each stanza explores part of the contrast between Jesus' divinity and humanity. The first stanza contrasts the grand idea of "royal David's city" with the lowliness of a cattle-shed, and the second, the glory of heaven, from where He came, with the poverty of earth to which He came. The hymn ends by reminding us that Christ has ascended once again to glory.
