Children's Sermon

WORD

The 1st lesson is a reading from Isaiah, the 43rd chapter.

But now thus says the Lord, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honored, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, "Give them up," and to the south, "Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth—everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made."

Hymn History - Our Hymn of the Day “Shall We Gather at the River” was written by a cheerful pastor of mid-1800's Baptist churches in the Eastern United States. Robert Lowry, called the “Good Doctor” was said to have a great ability to vividly describe pictures from his imagination, captivating audiences with his own inspirational thoughts. He set some of Fanny Crosby's hymns to music, and wrote the words and music to the gospel song “What can wash away my Sins? Nothing but the blood of Jesus.” On a sweltering day in July 1864, he mused about Revelation 22:1 “And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding from the throne of God and of the Lamb.” In Robert Lowry's mind, the words gradually came together along with the hymn. First came the question “Shall we gather at the River?” Then came the answer “Yes, we'll gather.”
