

The first lesson is a reading from Isaiah, the 62nd chapter.

For with you is the well of life, and in your light we see light.


Continue your lovingkindness to those who know you, and your favor to those who are true of heart.

The 2nd lesson is a reading from I Corinthians, the 12th chapter.

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Let Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the

utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.





*<u>The Holy Gospel according to John, the 2nd chapter.</u> C: Glory to you, O Lord.


On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." Now standing there were six stone water jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

Hymn History – Our gathering song today "Soul, Adorn Yourself with Gladness" was written by Johann Franck, born in Brandenburg, Germany in 1618. After his father's death his uncle ensured his education, culminating in law at the University of Königsberg. This school was the only University in Prussia, present Germany, undisturbed during the 30 years war in central Europe. During those college years, his religious spirit, his love of nature, and his friendship with others with a love of poetry and hymn writing, preserved him from sharing in the excesses of his fellow students. As a lawyer Johann Franck served in several public service roles amidst the turmoil of the war while writing more than 110 hymns. As with our hymn we sing, Franck's hymns were said to have a less congregational and more personal, individual tone; especially the longing for the inward and mystical union of Christ with the soul.
