Pastor's Message

He is Risen, He is Risen Indeed!

"The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay." Matthew 28:5-6

As the first light of dawn broke on that fateful morning, my heart was heavy with sorrow. I, Mary Magdalene, along with the other Mary, felt the weight of despair as we made our way to the tomb of Jesus. Our beloved Teacher, our Lord, had been crucified just three days before, and the pain of our loss was fresh and unbearable.

We walked quietly, our hearts aching as we remembered the

moments we had shared with Him—the teachings, the miracles, the love He had shown us. We had come to pay our respects, and to anoint His body with spices as a final act of love. As we approached the tomb, a sense of dread filled the air. Who would roll away the stone for us?

But as we arrived, a great earthquake shook the ground. My heart raced in fear. Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared, his countenance like lightning, and his clothes white as snow. The guards, so powerful and fearsome, trembled and became like dead men. I clutched the other Mary's arm, both of us frozen in shock at the sight before us.

The angel spoke to us, his voice calm yet commanding. "Do not be afraid," he said. "I know you seek Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; He has risen, just as He said. Come, see the place where He lay."

I could hardly process the words. Risen? My mind raced, and a glimmer of hope flickered within the depths of my sorrow. The angel gestured toward the empty tomb, and we stepped forward cautiously, peering inside. The grave clothes were neatly folded, and the stone that had sealed the tomb was now rolled away.

In that moment, joy and disbelief mingled in my heart. Our Lord was alive! The angel instructed us to go quickly and tell the disciples, proclaiming the good news of His resurrection. With renewed strength, we ran from the tomb, our sorrow transformed into joy, our despair into hope.

As we hurried along, the reality of what had just occurred began to sink in. Our Rabbi, the one who had shown us such love and grace, had conquered death. I could hardly contain the excitement. We had to share this miraculous news!

In the midst of our fear and joy, I knew that everything had changed. This was not just a moment; it was the beginning of a new reality, a promise fulfilled. The resurrection of Jesus was the cornerstone of our faith. He had Risen, He had Risen indeed!

Congregational Council Meeting, March 10, 2025

† At six o'clock pm the regular monthly meeting of the Congregational Council of St. Paul's ELCA, Lohman, Missouri was called into session by Council President Zola Finch.

The council members present were Debbie Raithel, Gus Fischer, Zola Finch, AJ Ferrell, Michelle Collins and Debi Berry. Dan Tschirgi, Kent Nelson, Misty Schroeder, and Ashleigh Hillen were absent. Pastor Viles was in attendance. A prayer by Pastor David Viles started off the meeting.

† The President requested approval of the previous Council minutes; this was done upon a motion by AJ Ferrell, seconded by Gus Fischer and approved by all.

† Michelle Collins presented the Church Treasurer report. Income totals for February 2025 showed a total of \$13,280.62, with expense totals for February 2025 at \$13,087.36. We had interest paid on the CD due in April of \$7.85. There was a \$100.00 transfer out for Cemetery. The new excel file sheet that was created for use with reporting monthly, year-end, and the ELCA report is working out wonderfully. The statement balanced.

† Pastor's report showed six February meetings with parish and local groups. Pastor met with the Church Council, and had 9 visits, 1 funeral, 5 services: 2 with communion and 2 noncommunion, 1 Baptism, and Ash Wednesday. In addition, the 9 visits and consultations were with our parishioners and others. In addition, Pastor answered text messages and phone messages daily. Activities: He updated our Church Website and video service. He created and emailed the March Epistle. Pastor aided a parishioner with transportation to an appointment, attended a member birthday party, and donated blood.

President Finch: requested our committee chairpersons to present their reports on recent activities.

Evangelism: Misty Schroeder was absent therefore Zola Finch presented the report. Zola reminded the council of the pancake breakfast scheduled on March 16th from 10:00 to 1:00. There will be pancakes, sausage, apples, and drinks. There will be a cost of \$10.00 per adult, \$5.00 for children 6 years to 12 years old, and children 5 years and under will be free. Pastor redid the flyer. A card and a gift card were presented to Marie Scheperle, and she was pleased. There will also be a spaghetti luncheon, April 6th immediately after services. To-go boxes will be available. The luncheon will be from 10:30 to 1:00. There will also be salad, garlic bread, desserts and A FREE WILL OFFERING. There will be a chili and soup dinner on 5 October from 3:30 to 6:30. A motion for approval of the report was made by Debi Berry and seconded by Debbie Raithel. Approved by all.

Technology: Dan was absent but provided his report. The screens are up and installed. Live stream on Facebook is now fixed. They are working on the casting on the television screens and discussing the use of HTMI splitters. There is still an added need for workers to run and perform the balcony duties as well as flipping the slides on the I-Pad. As always, it is hoped some of our teens and young adults will step up to this task. A vacuum was provided for use on the balcony. A motion for approval of the report was made by AJ Ferrell and seconded by Gus Fischer. Approved by all.

Worship & Music: Ashleigh Hillen was absent therefore, Zola reported that there was no in-person meeting in February; however, March and April hymn choices are selected and approved. The setting has been set to 3 was mentioned as a reminder. All services are now at 6 pm. A motion for approval of the report was made by AJ Ferrell and seconded by Gus Fischer. Approved by all.

A motion for approval of the report was made by AJ Ferrell and seconded by Gus Fischer. Approved by all.

Parish Education: A.J. Ferrell and Wendy Barker will be alternating Sunday school. A.J. reported that the schedule for Sunday School in 2025 will remain the same as in this past year. Also, VBS is tentatively scheduled to be held the 6th through the 10th of July. They are researching grants for some additional resources for the property for all ages. A motion for approval of the report was made by Debi Berry and seconded by Gus Fischer. Approved by all.

Church Improvement: Kent Nelson was absent however; it was noted that he is wondering if we want to paint the conduits on the wall leading to the monitors. A motion for approval of the report was made by AJ Ferrell and seconded by Gus Fischer. Approved by all.

Stewardship/Finance: Gus Fischer presented quotes for the possibility of having to pursue additional insurance if the Parsonage does not start being used. A motion for approval of the report was made by Debi Berry and seconded by Debbie Raithel. Approved by all.

Mutual Ministry: Debbie Raithel mentioned that their committee did not meet in February. They are meeting in March. All the times for the photos for the picture directory are booked. Working with the photographer to obtain another date and time. A motion for approval of the report was made by AJ Ferrell and seconded by Gus Fischer. Approved by all.

Old Business: Reminder that there is a Church Parsonage, and a Church basement rental form: The form should be completed after confirming the date with Pastor, and given to him. If you have a need to rent either location, please see Pastor. A motion for approval of the report was made by Debi Berry and seconded by Debbie Raithel. Approved by all.

New Business: There will be a Central States Synod Assembly from 5-7 June in Olathe Kansas (Thurs – Sat). Registration closes 15 May and if you are interested, please contact Pastor. It requests one male and one female to attend. The church pays the costs.

Recommendations were submitted to make the following additions/changes to the parsonage:

Replace storm door handle – council discussing; Replace the lock – council discussing; Put in a dusk to dawn light – council voted no need; Bring the old stove from garage to kitchen –council voted that there is no interest in utilizing the old stove – recommend that new gas stove be purchased; Remove boxes on back porch – council discussing; Use the furniture in the basement for upstairs – council voted no, as it is old, molding – recommend asking parishioners if they have any that they are willing to donate – council still discussing.

Spring clean-up day will be scheduled soon prior to Easter. Speak with Kent Nelson and request pest control be done.

Debi Berry has seven members thus far who are interested in forming a craft group, i.e., card making, diamond dotting, wood painting, scrapbooking, crocheting, and knitting lessons, etc. Debi Berry will be the POC and will be posting a sign-up sheet in the Narthex? If you have any questions, her phone number is in the directory. Debi Berry will be posting a flyer on Sunday to ascertain interest in attending the crucifixion and resurrection program by the Lesters on Saturday April 19th at 6 pm. Please sign-up if interested. At 7:39 President Finch declared the meeting in adjournment. The meeting ended with a recitation of the Our Father led by Pastor Viles.
